## IDS 2891 Connections: Global Citizenship: Identity and Culture of the Afro-Brazilian

**This is an exciting opportunity for Summer 2017!** This two-week study will focus on the history, arts, and culture of the Afro-Brazilian. Through a series of lectures, guided tours, and workshops, students will learn about the meaning of diversity and its challenges in Brazilian society. They will discover how the heritage of both European and African cultures engage to produce a community with a distinct voice of racial awareness.

### Eligibility:

- Have earned at least 6 college-level credits prior to the anticipated travel date.
- Preference will be given to students who have completed at least 45 credit hours of coursework toward their degree.\*
- Must be at least 18 years old at the time of travel.
- Have a 2.0 GPA at the application deadline date.

\*Students who completed IDS 2891 OR do not meet the 45 credit hours requirement are welcome to audit the course.

### Estimated Costs:

- **Approximately \$3,500 before scholarship award,**
- **\$2,200 after scholarship award.**
- Cost includes: airfare, airport taxes, in-country transportation, accommodations (double occupancy rooms), travel medical insurance, tours, workshops, lectures, breakfast and dinner.
- Cost does NOT include: Tuition and fees (1 credit), passport application (if needed).
- **Additional awards may be available for qualified students.**

### Award Recipient Eligibilities:

- Apply by the deadline date to receive the full scholarship amount.
- Be a degree-seeking student at HCC (dual enrollment and transient students do not qualify for an award).
- Be enrolled in at least 6 credit hours at the time of application.
- In order to retain your scholarship after enrolling, you must meet all course and attendance requirements, obtain a grade of C or better and complete a scholarship project in collaboration with the CIE office.
