Health Care System

STANDARD OF CARE

The quality of health care services available in China are not in par with the United States, but has improved in recent years. The Ministry of Public Health (MOPH) is chiefly responsible for the healthcare system in the country. Health care services are available in both rural as well as urban areas. Major cities have medical centers that provide good medical facilities. Shanghai has many hospitals and clinics that are well-equipped with international staff. City hospitals have 'Gaughan bingfang' or VIP facility wards which are equipped with the latest medical technology and highly skilled physicians. Most of these wards are made for the ease of foreigners and often have doctors and nurses who speak English. In rural areas, preventive and primary-health care services are provided by doctors through village medical centers. Medical personnel in rural areas are poorly trained and have limited access to medical equipment and medicines. Health care services offered by state-owned hospitals are poor and medication may be expensive. Travelers are advised to check the quality of health care services and sanitation level before seeking treatment. Hospitals in large cities such as Beijing and Shanghai maintain high standards of hygiene. In smaller cities and rural areas, hygiene standards are generally low. Travelers with serious medical problems are advised to take necessary precautions while traveling outside major cities, especially to the rural and interior areas of the country.
